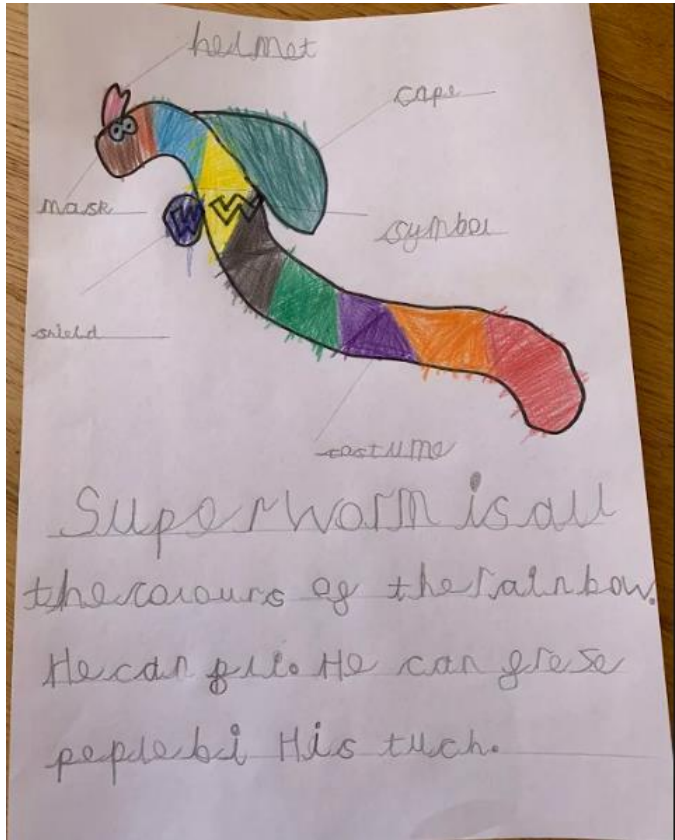

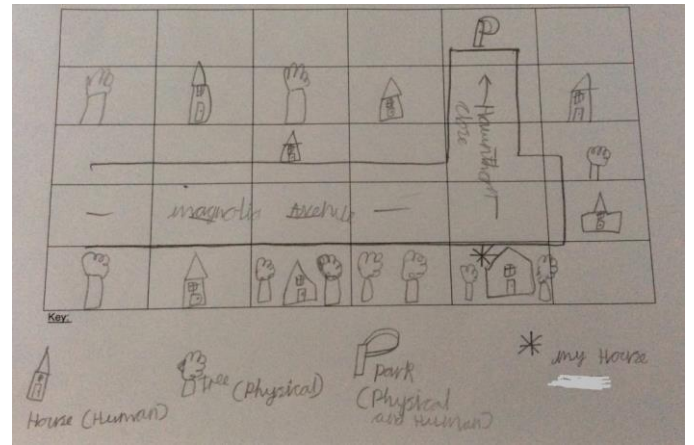

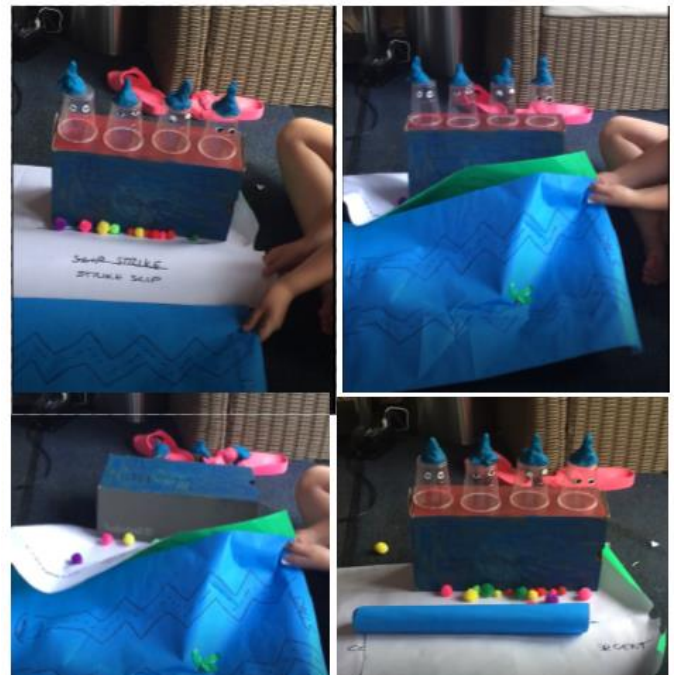
Surely we have an unbelievable view around our school with trees, plants, grass and greenery. Your factory would block it out completely. Is that what you really want?

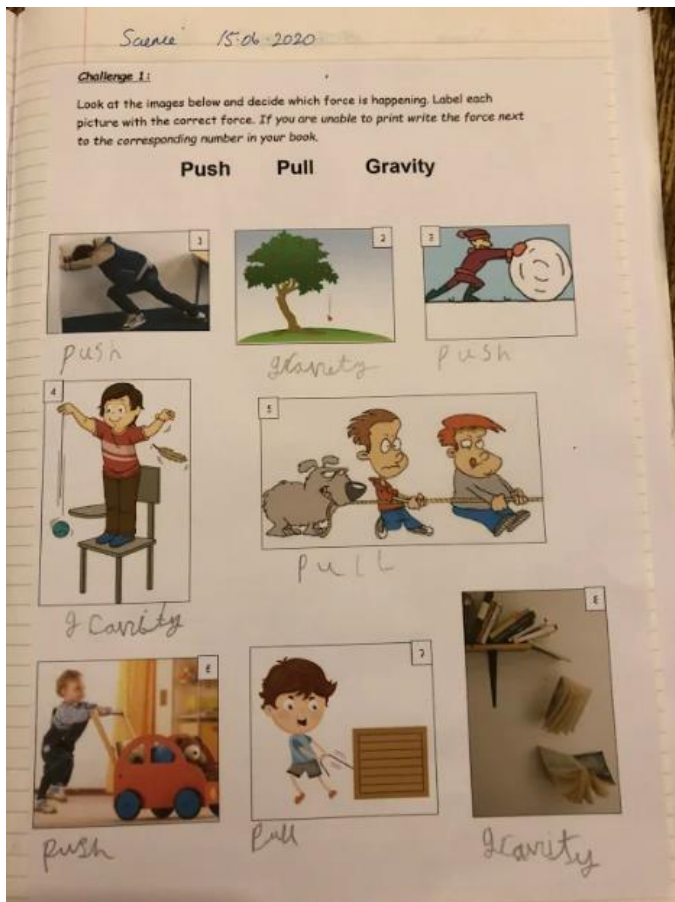
