Physical Education

Children will move in different ways.

Children will enjoy looking at a range of books.

Children will talk about what they draw, write and paint.
Children will begin to write their name by themselves.
Children will use recognisable letters in their writing.

Maths

Children will count to 10.
Children will know how old they are.
Children will recognise some numbers in the environment.
Children will make marks to record numbers and quantity.
Children will describe and name shapes.
Children will recognise and talk about shapes in the environment.
Children will say who is next to/ behind / in front of them.
Children will know when someone has more/ less than themselves.
Children will match number to quantity.

Expressive Arts and Design

Children will enjoy singing.
Children will move to music.
Children will sing along to favourite songs
Children will use different media.
Children will use construction materials.
Children will talk about what they are going to make.
Children will talk about what they have made.
Children will act out a story in my play.
Children will play with others.

Bringing Learning to Life

Children will take a walk to the local library where they will listen to a story and explore books.
Children will use mirrors to identify and explore different emotions.
Children will take part in senses experiments.
