Pupil Premium Allocation 2020-21

The Pupil Premium is allocated to schools to work with pupils who have been registered for free school meals at any point in the last six years (known as 'Ever 6 FSM') and Children Looked After. The allocation for 2020-21 is £1345 per eligible pupil and £2345 for each Looked After Child. There are currently 89 pupils (21.4%) eligible for support at Tanners Wood. The Pupil Premium allocation for 2020-21 is therefore £119,705.00.

The main barriers to educational achievement for eligible children are:

- Social and emotional well-being, including emerging mental health needs
- Delays in speech and language
- Supporting children with regular attendance and punctuality
- Supporting children to manage their behaviour and emotions
- Providing equality of opportunity for pupils to access trips/visits
- Gaps in skill and knowledge within core subjects
- Gaps in parenting skills
- A range of Special Educational Needs such as MLD, ADHD, ASD
- School mobility – movement into and out of the school
- Low aspirations for some families
- Lack of cultural capital

The date of the next review of the school's Pupil Premium strategy will be July 2021.

In-school Interventions (Year groups 1-6) for Maths and Literacy to support PPG children in danger of not attaining in line with non-PPG peers. This includes part funding of 2 x teachers and 2 additional TAs	£60,000	Accelerated progress for identified children reducing the attainment gap with non-PPG peers.
Purchase of Intervention Resources – e.g. RWI spelling resources.	£2,000	Quality, proven intervention materials leading to accelerated progress for identified children therefore reducing the attainment gap with non-PPG peers.
Additional Teaching Assistants in the Reception Class to enable early identification and intervention for foundation stage children at risk of falling behind their peers.	£20,000	The majority of foundation stage children to make good or better progress (80%) and most children to reach good or better attainment. Identified children are provided with pre-teaching and extra input to ensure that they keep up with their peer group.
Family Support Worker help for identified families in a range of year groups (part funding with PPG money) to include monitoring and follow up of attendance	£9,000	Identified families are better able to support their children with learning. PPG children will make accelerated progress and the attainment gap will reduce with non-PPG children. Attendance will be high and attitudes to
Play therapy / therapeutic play / counselling for identified children in all year groups as needed.	£8,000	Improved behaviour and self-regulation of target children over time. Fewer exclusions for identified children. Children are better able to cope with school.
Subsidise the cost of all school residential visits for PPG children and swimming lessons.	£3,500	PPG pupils will attend all residential visits. Swimming subsidised.
To continue with monitoring to improve attendance	£1,205	Increased parental involvement with the school. Subsequent improved progress and attainment.
Continuing Professional Development for all staff in areas of need.	£2,000	Standards of teaching and learning improved. Vulnerable pupils are better supported and receiving higher quality feedback.
Purchase 35 Chromebooks to support online remote learning	£14,000	Equity for PPG in accessing Google Classroom

Total spend on strategies to raise achievement and progress for pupils eligible for Pupil Premium is £119,705.

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
